Oggetto: Regolamento I.F.A.B. – REGOLA 4 – L'equipaggiamento dei calciatori

L'I.F.A.B. in occasione della sua 131° Assemblea Generale Annuale, tenutasi a Londra il 3 marzo 2017 ha apportato diverse modifiche alle Regole del Giuoco Calcio. In particolare alla Regola 4 viene disciplinato l'utilizzo, in competizioni ufficiali, dei sistemi elettronici di monitoraggio e rilevamento delle performance (EPTS). Tali sistemi dovranno riportare il logo:



che indica l'apparecchiatura ufficialmente testata e approvata dall'I.F.A.B. e che possiede i requisiti minimi di sicurezza stabiliti per il suo utilizzo.

I requisiti minimi di sicurezza sono obbligatori dal 1° giugno 2017; i sistemi già in uso godono di un periodo di transizione, fino al 31 maggio 2018, per consentire di ottemperare alle necessarie certificazioni.

Quanto sopra per informare le società sull'utilizzo di sistemi EPTS in possesso delle certificazioni stabilite dall'I.F.A.B., anche al fine di richiedere l'autorizzazione alla F.I.G.C. per la loro adozione.

Other equipment - electronic performance and tracking systems (EPTS)

Additional text

Where wearable technology (WT) as part of electronic performance and tracking systems (EPTS) is used in matches played in an official competition organised under the auspices of FIFA, confederations or national football associations, the technology attached to the player's equipment must bear the following mark:



This mark indicates that it has been officially tested and meets the minimum safety requirements of the International Match Standard developed by FIFA and approved by The IFAB. The institutes conducting the tests are subject to the approval of FIFA. The transition period runs until 31 May 2018.

Explanation

It is important that any EPTS used by players is certified as having satisfied established minimum safety criteria. This requirement is compulsory as from 1 June 2017; systems already in use have a transition period for compliance which ends on 31 May 2018.

LAW 5 – THE REFEREE

Decisions of the referee

Additional text

The decisions of the referee regarding facts connected with play, including whether or not a goal is scored and the result of the match, are final. The decisions of the referee, and all other match officials, must always be respected.

Explanation

It is a fundamental principle of football that match officials' decisions must always be respected (even when they are incorrect).

Disciplinary action

Additional text

The referee (...)

- has the power to show yellow or red cards and, where competition rules permit, temporarily dismiss a player, from entering the field at the start of the match until after the match (...)

Explanation

National FAs may now allow temporary dismissals in youth, veterans, disability and grassroots football.

Disciplinary action

Additional text

The referee (...)

- takes action against team officials who fail to act in a responsible manner and may expel them from the field of play and its immediate surrounds; a medical team official who commits a dismissible offence may remain if the team has no other medical person available, and act if a player needs medical attention.
